Randolph State Park -Youth Trail Ride

Meeting was called to order at 12:20 p.m.

A motion to accept prior meeting minutes with no changes or additions was passed.

Trish Cleveland gave treasure's report, we have a balance of \$583.

Pattie Stalder reported the display boxes and trail brochures are up at the north and south kiosks. We also discussed adding a QR code to the trail map brochures so you can scan with your phone to access the map.

Patti Dollarhide let us know that Denise Norhus of Norhus Fabrications in Marysville, donated the metal, alphabet trail indicators and posts. Future park improvements were discussed regarding the pens being built. We have to purchase the corner posts which will cost about \$1k. The goal is for the 2nd loop to all have horse pens at each campsite. We may have some funds to help with the \$1k from Park Manager, Levi Gantenbein. Other ideas for improvements are hitching posts at the bathrooms and a manure bunk in loop 2.

There was a plan to have a NACTRC ride at Randolph on Oct 15 but after discussion regarding the possibility of losing money, plus all the volunteer work required to host the ride, we decided to make that date a public ride open to everyone.
